# Basic Knit-Look Crochet Stitches

## Waistcoat Stitch



**Looks like:** stockinette

Dense; gap-free; good for Fair Isle patterns, accessories, toys, and home-goods

**Basic pattern:** Working in the round, single crochet into vertical legs of each stitch (not top two loops)

## HDC Ribbing

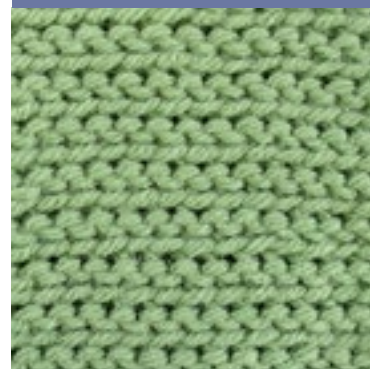


**Looks like:** knit ribbing

Flexible; gap-free; ribbed; good for cuffs and hat brims

**Basic pattern:** Half-double crochet slip stitch into back loop only (special instructions needed for hdc sl st)

## Slip Stitch: Flat



**Looks like:** garter or stockinette stitch

Delicate texture; gap-free; good for accessories, garments, and washcloths

**Basic pattern:** Slip stitch into front loop only

## Back Loop SC

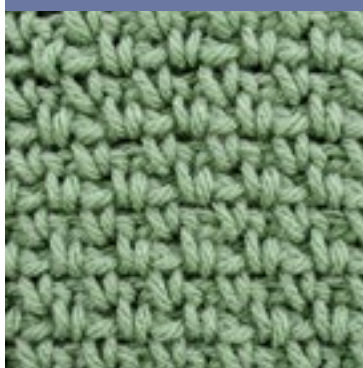


**Looks like:** garter stitch, fine ribbing

Stretchy; drapes well; gap-free; good for tapestry crochet, garments and accessories

**Basic pattern:** Working in the round, single crochet into the back loop only

## Linen/Moss Stitch



**Looks like:** knit linen stitch

Stretchy; drapes well; good for garments, blankets, and accessories

**Basic pattern:** Row 1: (Ch 1, sk next st, sc into next st) across. Row 2: (Ch 1, sc into ch sp, ch 1, sk next sc) across

## Slip Stitch: Circular



**Looks like:** garter stitch

Flexible; gap-free; good for accessories, toys, and home goods

**Basic pattern:** Working in the round, slip stitch into the front loop only
